The exercise aims to educate participants about current events, International relations and policies, diplomacy and the UN agenda. KLE MUN provided a platform to enhance and reciprocate cooperative diplomacy and refine sets of young delegates to take on global challenges. It enabled the in- depth examination and resolution of pressing issues, emphasizing process over product.
