The Tuaregs are predominantly nomadic people of the Sahara desert, found mostly in the northern reaches of Mali near Timbuktu and Kidal. The Tuareg are often referred to as the ‘ Blue Men of the desert’ as the men cover themselves in heavy blue robes. Adult men traditionally wear a veil in front of women and strangers. The sword is a Tuareg’s most valued possession. Many are passed from generation to generation and are said to be protected by the victories of their past owners. Women process milk , make butter, prepare animal skin, and collect firewood and water. Men drive the animals and are responsible for selling their produce. The men take the camels to towns to sell, returning with millet which they grind into flour for bread.
